### THEME - "A COUNTRY PICNIC"

Note: All printing and writing is to be on lined paper.

## PRE-SCHOOL AND JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN:

### SECTION

1. A painting using a corn cob as a roller on approx 21 cm x 28 cm paper
2. A decorated handprint on approximately 21 cm x 28 cm paper

## **KINDERGARTEN:**

3. A picnic basket made of dried pasta, seeds and/or beans on a paper plate.
4. A painting of a strawberry, using only tempera paint on approx 46 cm x 60 cm

## **GRADE 1:**

5. An ant made from sections of an egg carton. No larger than 15 cm.
6. A coloured picture of a country picnic, hand drawn, using crayons, approximately 30 cm x 46cm
7. Printing: First name only, printed on construction paper in the shape of a flower, approximately 20 cm. x 20 cm. Printed in PENCIL ONLY. No lined paper required. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class.

## **GRADE 2:**

8. Weave a placemat out of construction paper strips. Approximately 22x30cm.
9. A daisy using mixed media, on approximately 30 cm x 46 cm paper
10. Printing: Printed in PENCIL, on any primary paper.  
A bug flew in my ear  
I could not hear too well.  
A bug flew in my nose  
And then I could not smell.

## **GRADE 3:**

11. A 3-D flower using cut out hand prints for petals.
12. A flower garden, made from torn paper, on paper approximately 30cm x 46cm
13. Printing: Printed in PENCIL, every other line on half sheet of lined paper.  
We brought a rug for sitting on,  
Our lunch was in a box.  
The sand was warm. We didn't wear  
Hats or shoes or socks.

## **GRADE 4:**

14. A 3-D teddy bear dressed for a picnic, approximately 60 cm high. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class
15. Grapes on the Vine, using mixed media, approximately 30cm x 46cm
16. Printing: Printed in PENCIL, every other line on half sheet of lined paper.  
I love red apples,  
I love red apples,  
And I could eat them every day.  
I love them crunchy,  
I love them munchy,  
Apples keep the doctor away.

## GRADE 5:

17. A picnic table made out of popsicle sticks. Approximate size of a Kleenex box.
18. Design a wallpaper border with a picnic theme, showing the pattern repeat, approx 50 cm (20 inches) long and 15 cm (6 inches) wide, any media.
19. Writing: Written in INK or PENCIL, on EVERY line on half sheet of lined paper.

Let us have a little picnic  
underneath the Sandwich tree.  
Pick yourself that tuna salad.  
Pick a ham-and-cheese for me.  
Mayo from the mayo bush  
Ketchup from the vine.  
You can pick a peck of pickles but

22. Writing: Written in INK or PENCIL, on EVERY line on half sheet of lined paper.

25. Writing: Written in INK , on EVERY line of half sheet of lined paper

## **SUNFLOWERS**

Sponsored by the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture

GRADE 4 and GRADE 5

Each student in Grades 4 and 5 in the local schools will be given a packet of sunflower seeds in April to plant in May and care for. On Monday, September 26, (the week of Caledonia fair), each student is asked to bring to school:

One tallest sunflower plant (no dirt on the roots)

and one largest sunflower head

Each must be labelled with the student's name, age, grade, school and category, and then tied to the sunflower.

Judging is done by the principal and teacher on Tuesday, September 27, 2011. Each winner at the school receives a certificate provided by the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture.

The winning specimens are to be taken to Caledonia Fair on Wednesday, September 28, 2011 between 3 p.m. and 9 p.m. Each specimen is to have a school tag that can be obtained at the school or the Fair Office.

Judging will be done by the President and Vice President of the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture. A champion rosette will be given to the tallest sunflower plant and the biggest sunflower head. A reserve champion rosette will also be awarded in the two categories.

Rosettes must be picked up on Sunday, October 2, 2011. at 6:30 p.m. at the Fair. Each winner's school will be contacted after the judging to notify the student about pick-up. Each champion school receives a plaque to display until the following May. It must then be returned to the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture.
