Entry tags should be placed in the upper right hand corner of artwork/ printing.

Only one entry from each pupil in each section and a limit of five entries from each grade in a classroom.

Pupils name and school must appear on the entry tags only.

School entry tags to be filled out by the teacher or parent to certify that it is solely the work of the student.

Tags are available from the Society Secretary or the School Principal.

Entries to be placed in the Exhibition Hall between 3pm and 8pm on Wednesday, September 25, 2024. Tags must be attached.

Due to limited space, only prize winners may be displayed.

All exhibits must remain until Sunday, September 29, 2024 and must be collected at 6:00pm on Sunday, September 29, 2024 by an adult representative.

Directors are not responsible for articles left after 6:15pm on Sunday, September 29, 2024. Articles left after this time may be disposed of.

Homeschooling and Preschool– put name, address, and phone number on the back of each entry tag.

CRAFTS, ART, PRINTING

Theme: Sew It, Grow It, Show It!

Note: All printing is to be on lined paper.

PRESCHOOL AND JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN

SECTION

1. A painting of an apple on approximately 21cm x 28cm paper
2. A traced outline of your forearm and open hand, decorated to look like an autumn tree, on approximately 21cm x 28cm paper (adult may help to trace)

KINDERGARTEN

SECTION

3. A jack-o-lantern face made of torn paper on a paper plate
4. A painting of a flower using only tempera paint on approximately 30cm x 46cm paper

GRADE 1

SECTION

5. A brown paper lunch bag puppet of a farm animal
6. A coloured picture of a tractor, hand drawn, using crayons, approximately 30cm x 46cm
7. Printing: first name only, printed on colourful construction paper in the shape of a flower, approximately 15cm x 15cm. Printed in pencil only. No lined paper required. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class.

GRADE 2

SECTION

8. Weave a placemat out of multi-coloured construction paper, approximately 22cm x 30cm
9. A sunflower using mixed media, on approximately 30cm x 46cm paper
10. Printing: printed in pencil on any primary paper
Grow, grow, grow a plant
Starting with the seed.
Give it soil, sun, and water
That is all you need.

GRADE 3

SECTION

11. A farm animal pet rock, not to exceed 15cm in any direction
12. A flower garden using a combination of tissue paper and construction paper, on paper approximately 30cm x 46cm
13. Printing: printed in pencil, every other line on half sheet of lined paper
Rain on the green grass,
Rain on the tree,
Rain on the housetop,
But not on me.

GRADE 4

SECTION

14. A colourful kite with a tail, approximately 30cm excluding tail
15. Grapes on the Vine, using mixed media, approximately 30cm x 46cm
16. Printing: printed in pencil, every other line on a half sheet of lined paper
Autumn winds begin to blow,
Coloured leaves fall fast and slow
Whirling, twirling all around,
'Til at last they touch the ground.

GRADE 5

SECTION

17. A birdhouse made out of popsicle sticks, not to exceed 15 cm in all directions. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class
18. Design a wallpaper border with a fall theme, showing the pattern repeat, approximately 50cm (20 inches) long and 15cm (6 inches) wide, any media.
19. Printing: printed in ink or pencil on every line on a half sheet of lined paper
I'm a little pumpkin
orange and round.
Here is my stem,
there is the ground.
When I get all cut up,
don't you shout!
Just open me up
and scoop me out!

SECTION

20. A decorated flower pot, not to exceed 10cm in height. For this entry only 10 submissions for class.
21. A "Caledonia Bridge" sunset, any media, approximately 30cm x 46cm
22. Printing: printed in ink or pencil on every line on a half sheet of lined paper
I like vegetables
Carrots and string beans.
And I love broccoli,
Brussel sprouts and greens.
Of all the vegetables,
There's only one I hate,
And I hate lima beans
I flick them off my plate.

GRADE 7

SECTION

23. A split image sketch of a person's face. Cut out a picture and paste half of the face onto a piece of paper. Sketch the other half of the face on the other half of the paper. The whole picture is not to exceed 30cm x 30cm
24. Illustrate an apple tree through the four seasons, any media, approximately 30cm x 30cm
25. Printing: printed in ink on every line on a half sheet of lined paper
October gave a party;
A little seed for me to sow.
A little seed to make it grow.
A little hole, a little pat,
A little wish and that is that.
A little sun, a little shower.
A little while, and then a flower.

78. Collage, Grades 9-12—The collage can be one or three dimensional. Attach a piece of paper to the collage on the back or bottom of the piece stating the chosen theme. Focus will be given to the collage technique, use of colour, application of at least three different media, and theme. Not to exceed 18" in any direction.

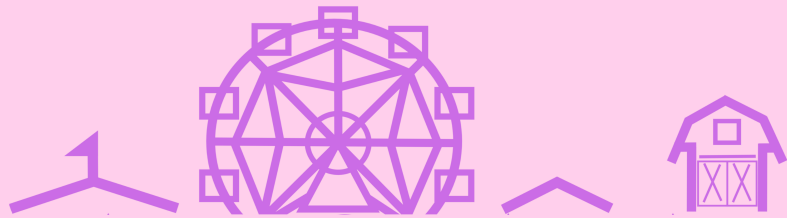


The Caledonia Agricultural Society is the CRA registered charity who own and operate the Caledonia Fairgrounds. The Society is made up of over 225 volunteer members.
