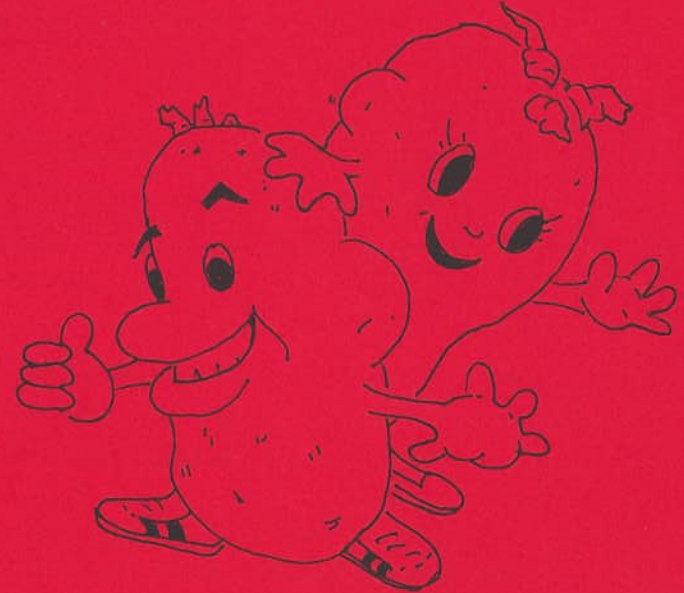

RULES

Entries will be disqualified if all printed rules and instructions are not followed.

1. Entry Tags should be placed in the upper right hand corner of Artwork, Printing and Writing.
2. Only one entry from each pupil in each section and a limit of five entries from each Grade in a Classroom.
3. Pupil's name and school must appear on the entry tags only.
4. School entry tags to be filled out by the teacher or parent to certify that it is solely the work of the student. Tags are available from the Society Secretary, 151 Caithness St. E., Caledonia or the School Principal.
5. Entries to be placed in The Exhibition Hall between 3:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 24, 2008. Tags must be attached.
6. Due to limited space, only prize winners may be displayed.
7. All exhibits must remain until Sunday, September 28, 2008. School Exhibit closes at 5 p.m. on Sunday, September 28, 2008.
8. Exhibits must be collected at 6:30 p.m. by an adult representative.
9. Directors are not responsible for articles left after 6:45 p.m. on Sunday, September 28, 2008.
10. Articles left after 6:45 p.m. may be disposed of by the Directors.
11. Homeschooling and Preschool: Put name, address and phone number on back of entry tag.

CRAFTS, ART, PRINTING/WRITING

THEME - "ONE POTATO, TWO POTATO"

Note: All printing and writing is to be on lined paper.

PRE-SCHOOL AND JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN:

SECTION

1. A painting using a com cob as a roller, on approximately 30 cm x 46 cm paper.
2. A decorated handprint, on approximately 23 cm x 23 cm paper

KINDERGARTEN:

3. A face made of dried pasta, seeds and/or beans on a paper plate.
4. A painting of a Mr. Potato Head using tempera paint on approximately 46 cm x 60 cm paper.

GRADE 1:

5. A paperbag puppet of an animal.
6. A coloured picture of one farm animal in a farm setting, hand drawn, using crayons, approximately 30 cm x 46cm
7. Printing: First name only, printed in FREE HAND on construction paper in the shape of a leaf, approximately 20 cm. x 20 cm. Printed in PENCIL ONLY. No lined paper required. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class.

GRADE 2:

8. A decorated paper lantern with handle, ready to hang, not to exceed 50 cm in height.
9. A butterfly using mixed media, on approximately 30 cm x 46 cm paper
10. Printing: The Alphabet, both upper and lower case letters in PENCIL, every other line on half a sheet of lined paper.

GRADE 3:

11. A farm animal pet rock approximately 15 cm in any direction.
12. A flower garden, made from torn paper, on paper approximately 30cm x 46cm
13. Printing:
Rain on the green grass
Rain on the tree
Rain on the housetop
But not on me.
Printed in PENCIL, every other line on half sheet of lined paper.

GRADE 4:

14. A sturdy 3-D scarecrow approximately 60 cm high. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class
15. Maple trees in the fall, crayon resist (picture in crayon with black paint wash over top) approximately 30cm x 46cm
16. Writing:
If I were an elephant
If I had an elephant's floppy ears
I'd wash them once in seven years
I'd use my trunk for a garden hose
And make a nozzle out of my nose
WRITTEN in PENCIL, every other line of half sheet of lined paper.

GRADE 5:

17. A bird house made out of popsicle sticks, not to exceed 30cm in all directions
18. Design a book cover for your favourite book, front only, any media.

19. Writing:
(prize winner from 2007 Creativity contest)
Cotton candy, hotdogs, fries
Laffy taffy, what a surprise!
Roller coasters, watch them soar,
Candy, candy, I want more!
Drawing contest, ice cream cones,
There's so many activity zones.

21. A garden scene, any media, approximately 30 cm x 46 cm
22. Writing:

gleaming yellow and so bright,

drifting in the sky.
We could ride a sunmobile
and we could touch the sunflakes.
I wonder how they'd feel.

GRADE 7:

23. A split image sketch of a person's face. Cut a picture from a magazine. Paste half the picture onto a piece of paper. Sketch the other half of the face on the other half of the paper. The whole picture is approximately 15cm. x 30 cm.
24. A bug's eye view of a garden through a picket fence, using pencil crayon, approximately 30cm x 46cm.

25. Writing:
One day I found two pumpkin seeds.
I planted one and pulled the weeds.
It sprouted roots and a big, long vine.
A pumpkin tree; I called it mine.
The pumpkin was quite round and fat.
(I really am quite proud of that.)

GRADE 4 and GRADE 5

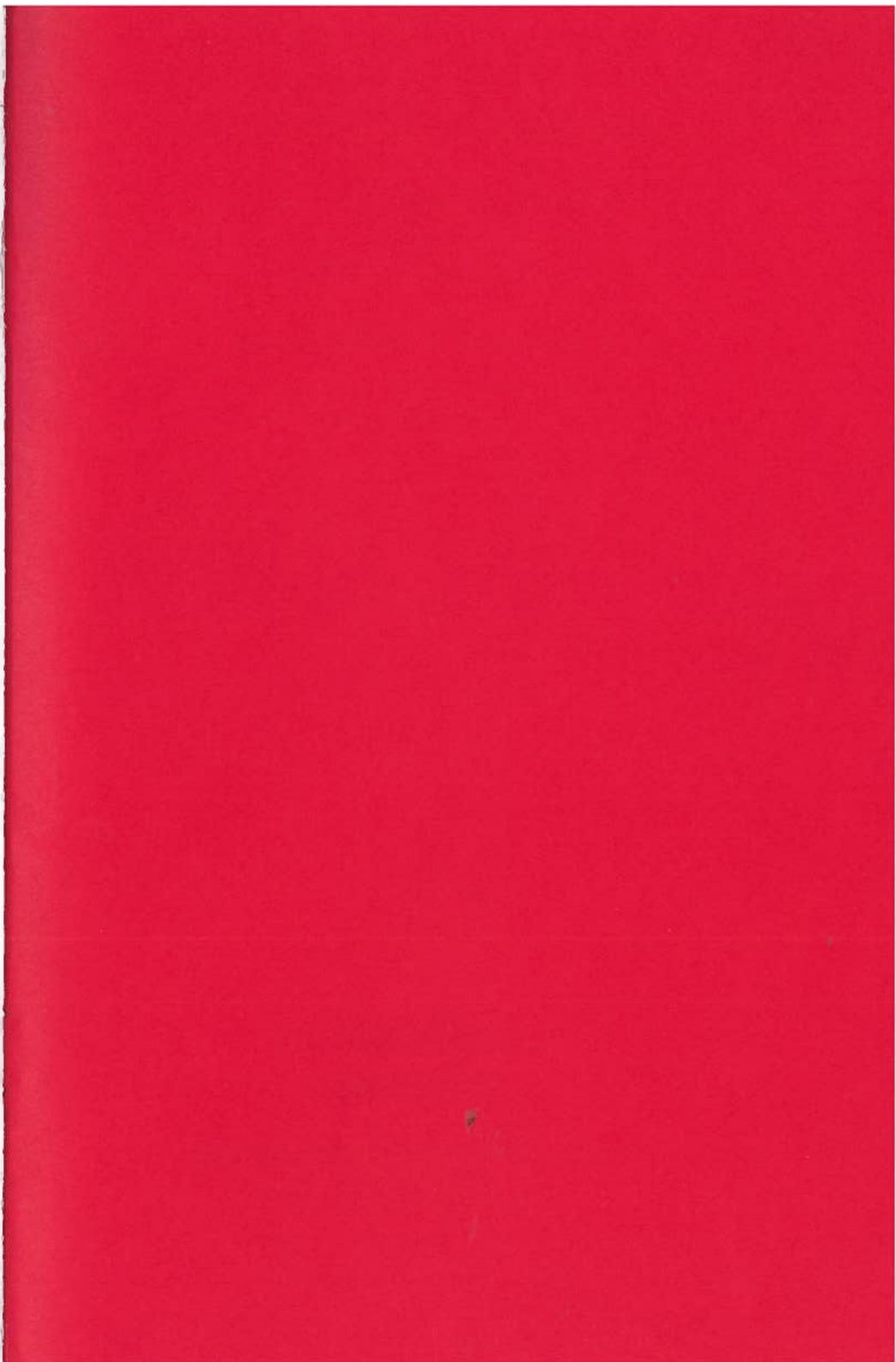
Each student in Grades 4 and 5 in the local schools will be given a packet of sunflower seeds in April to plant in May and care for. On Monday, September 22, (the week of Caledonia fair), each student is asked to bring to school:

One tallest sunflower plant (no dirt on the roots)

and one largest sunflower head

Each must be labelled with the student's name, age, grade, school and category, and then tied to the sunflower. Judging is done by the principal and teacher on Tuesday, September 23, 2008. Each winner at the school receives a certificate provided by the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture. The winning specimens are to be taken to Caledonia Fair on Wednesday, September 24, 2008 between 3 p.m. and 9 p.m. Each specimen is to have a school tag that can be obtained at the school or the Fair Office. Judging will be done by the President and Vice President of the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture. A champion rosette will be given to the tallest sunflower plant and the biggest sunflower head. A reserve champion rosette will also be awarded in the two categories.

Rosettes must be picked up on Sunday, September 28, 2008. at 6:30 p.m. at the Fair. Each winner's school will be contacted after the judging to notify the student about pick-up. Each champion school receives a plaque to display until the following May. It must then be returned to the Haldimand Federation of Agriculture.
