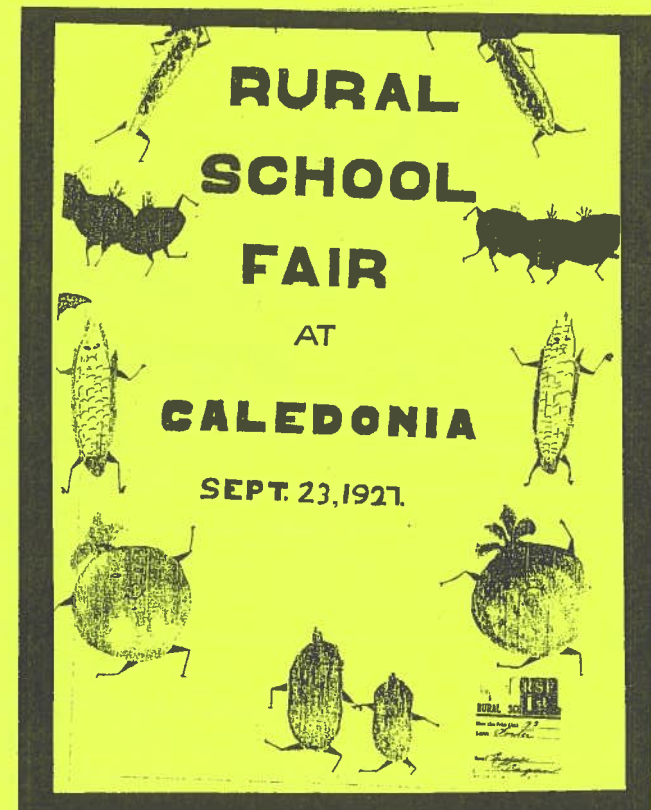

RULES

Entries will be disqualified if all printed rules and instructions are not followed.

1. Entry Tags should be placed in the upper right hand corner of Artwork, Printing and Writing.
2. Only one entry from each pupil in each section and a limit of five entries from each Grade in a Classroom.
3. Pupil's name and school must appear on the entry tags only.
4. School entry tags to be filled out by the teacher or parent to certify that it is solely the work of the student. Tags are available from the Society Secretary, 151 Caithness St. E., Caledonia or the School Principal.
5. Entries to be placed in The Exhibition Hall between 3:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 26, 2012. Tags must be attached.
6. Due to limited space, only prize winners may be displayed.
7. All exhibits must remain until Sunday, September 30, 2012. School Exhibit closes at 5 p.m. on Sunday, September 30, 2012.
8. **Exhibits must be collected at 6:30 p.m. by an adult representative.**
9. Directors are not responsible for articles left after 6:45 p.m. on Sunday, September 30, 2012.
10. Articles left after 6:45 p.m. may be disposed of by the Directors.
11. Homeschooling and Preschool: Put name, address and phone number on back of entry tag.

CRAFTS, ART, PRINTING/WRITING

THEME - "REMEMBER WHEN"

Note: All printing and writing is to be on lined paper.

PRE-SCHOOL AND JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN:

SECTION

1. A painting using a corn cob as a roller on approx 21 cm x 28 cm paper
2. A decorated handprint on approximately 21 cm x 28 cm paper

KINDERGARTEN:

3. A face made of dried pasta, seeds and/or beans on a paper plate.
4. A painting of an ice cream cone, using only tempera paint on approx 46 cm x 60 cm

GRADE 1:

5. An ant made from sections of an egg carton. No larger than 15 cm.
6. A coloured picture of an old school house, hand drawn, using crayons, approximately 30 cm x 46cm
7. Printing: First name only, printed on construction paper in the shape of an old school bell, approximately 20 cm. x 20 cm. Printed in PENCIL ONLY. No lined paper required. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class.

GRADE 2:

8. Weave a placemat out of construction paper strips. Approximately 22x30cm.
9. A daisy using mixed media, on approximately 30 cm x 46 cm paper
10. Printing: Printed in PENCIL, on any primary paper.
The alphabet, both upper and lower case letters, every other line on half a sheet of primary paper.

GRADE 3:

11. A 3-D tree using cut out hand prints for petals.
12. A vegetable garden, made from torn paper, on paper approximately 30cm x 46cm
13. Printing: Printed in PENCIL, every other line on half sheet of lined paper.
Little Jack Horner sat in a corner,
Eating his Christmas pie,
He put in his thumb and pulled out a plum
And said, What a good boy am I!

GRADE 4:

14. Transform any items out of your recycling bin into something you find on the farm - i.e. a 3D farm animal or a bale of hay. **For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class.**
15. Grapes on the Vine, using mixed media, approximately 30cm x 46cm
16. Printing: Printed in PENCIL, every other line on half sheet of lined paper.
Little Boy Blue come blow your horn
The sheep's in the meadow the cow's in the corn.
But where's the boy that looks after the sheep?
He's under a haystack fast asleep.
Will you wake him? No, not I - for if I do, he's sure to cry.

GRADE 5:

17. A covered wagon made out of popsicle sticks and other mixed media. Approximate size of a Kleenex box.
18. Design a wallpaper border with a historical theme, showing the pattern repeat, approx 50 cm (20 inches) long and 15 cm (6 inches) wide, any media.
19. Writing: Written in INK or PENCIL, on EVERY line on half sheet of lined paper.
Along the line of smoky hills
The crimson forest stands,
And all day long the bluejay calls
Throughout the autumn lands.

Now by the brook the maple leans,
With all his glory spread.
And all the sumacs on the hills
Have turned their green to red.

GRADE 6:

20. A lantern made from a 2L milk carton.
21. A "country" sunset, any media, approximately 30 cm x 46 cm
22. Writing: Written in INK or PENCIL, on EVERY line on half sheet of lined paper.
In Flanders Fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses row on row,
That mark our place; and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard among the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders Fields

GRADE 7:

23. A split image sketch of a person's face. Cut a picture from a magazine. Paste half the picture onto a piece of paper. Sketch the other half of the face on the other half of the paper. The whole picture is approx. 30 cm x 30 cm.
24. A child's eye view of a "penny candy" counter, using pencil crayons, approximately 30cm x 46cm.

25. Writing: Written in INK , on EVERY line of half sheet of lined paper
We're going to have a picnic.
We're looking forward to the fun.
We'll toss the ball around a bit
While we enjoy the shining sun.

We'll spread a blanket on the ground
Then we'll prepare to eat our food.
Relaxing with our family
Will make us feel so very good.

GRADE 8:

26. A bird feeder, ready to hang in the garden - creativity counts!
27. A CD cover for your favourite band, **IN AN EMPTY CD CASE**. Any media.
28. Writing: Written in INK on EVERY line on half sheet of lined paper.
I remember, I remember
Where I used to swing,
And thought the air must rush as fresh
To swallows on the wing;
My spirit flew in feathers then
That is so heavy now
The summer pools could hardly cool
The fever on my brow.

35. Grade 6 - 8: Sturdy marshmallow person, not to exceed 23 cm. in ALL directions.
36. Pre-school - Grade 2: Decorate an ice cream cone as a party hat with all edible decorations.
37. Grade 3 - 5: A large decorated cookie not to exceed 20cm.
38. Grade 6 to 8: One hard boiled egg decorated as an animal.
39. All Grades: Your favourite snack.
40. All Grades: Ugliest Cake Contest. Single layer, from mix. Use your imagination to create an "ugly" cake. Must be edible. Decorations not to overflow off the plate base. Cakeboard not to exceed 30 cm. Please cover with clear plastic wrap.
