What better way to reflect on our 150th Anniversary than to acknowledge and produce a prize book which calls to mind the rich history of the Caledonia Agricultural Society.

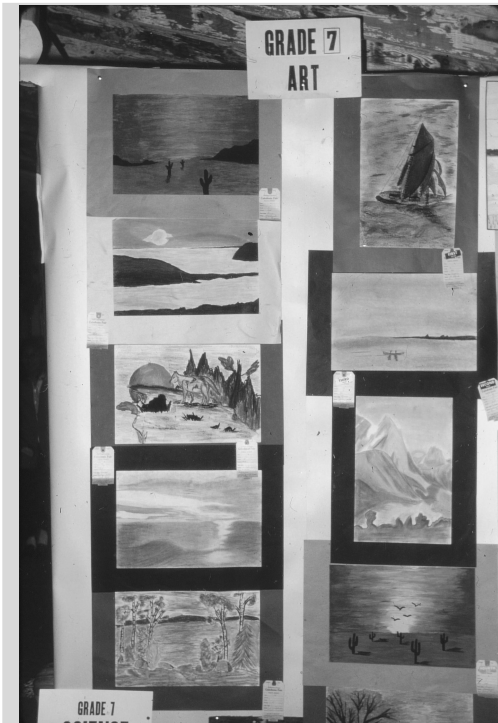
Our front cover is a piece of winning School Fair Artwork submitted by Eugene M. Fagan in 1927 advertising the School Fair held that year.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Entries will be disqualified if all printed rules and instructions are not followed. The judge's decision is final.

Entry tags should be placed in the upper right hand corner of artwork printing.

Only one entry from each pupil in each section and a limit of five entries from each grade in a classroom.

Pupils name and school must appear on the entry tags only.

School entry tags to be filled out by the teacher or parent to certify that it is solely the work of the student. Tags are available from the Society Secretary or the School Principal.

Entries to be placed in the Exhibition Hall between 3pm and 9pm on Wednesday, September 28, 2022. Tags must be attached.

Due to limited space, only prize winners may be displayed.

All exhibits must remain until Sunday, October 2, 2022 and must be collected at 6:30pm on Sunday, October 2, 2022 by an adult representative.

Directors are not responsible for articles left after 6:45pm on Sunday, October 2, 2022. Articles left after this time may be disposed of.

Homeschooling and Preschool– put name, address, and phone number on the back of each entry tag.

Spelling must be correct for all entries.

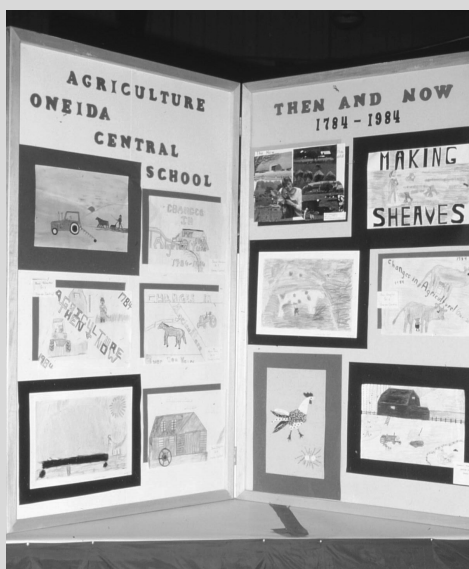

Note: All printing is to be on lined paper.

PRESCHOOL AND JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN

SECTION

1. A painting of a rainbow on approximately 21cm x 28cm paper
2. A traced outline of your forearm and open hand, decorated to look like an autumn tree, on approximately 21cm x 28cm paper (adult may help to trace)

KINDERGARTEN

SECTION

3. A face made of dried pasta, seeds, and/or beans on a paper plate
4. A painting of a butterfly using only tempera paint on approximately 30cm x 46cm paper

GRADE 1

SECTION

5. A jack-o-lantern made from a brown paper lunch bag
6. A coloured picture of a tractor, hand drawn, using crayons, approximately 30cm x 46cm
7. Printing: first name only, printed on colourful construction paper in the shape of a hand, approximately 15cm x 15cm. Printed in pencil only. No lined paper required. For this entry only, up to 10 submissions per class.

8. Weave a placemat out of multi-coloured construction paper, approximately 22cm x 30cm

25. Printing: printed in ink on every line on a half sheet of lined paper

The Women's Christian Temperance Union (W.C.T.U.) had a long running school special. It first appeared in 1943 as a "Temperance Poster" with first prize \$2.00 in "War Savings Stamps donated by Haldimand and Norfolk W.C.T.U. and Caledonia W.C.T.U." The W.C.T.U. special last appeared in 2005 as a free expression poster with the subject of "alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs as related to problems in the home" with first prize \$8.50.



Ruth Zadanyi is one of our longest-serving Fair Members— first joining the Society in 1964. Ruth has dedicated countless hours designing artwork which matches the theme of each Fair. Her fantastic artwork has graced the covers of Caledonia Fair Homecraft, Livestock, and School Fair prize books and Fair posters for nearly twenty years. Ruth was also the driving force behind the 'Secret Garden' craft and activity area which was a popular spot for children during the Fair until 2019 when the area was retired.
