- 1.—Canadian Harness Horse Association Rules to govern.
- 2.—Horses eligible day of race.
3. Trotters allowed 5 seconds.
- 4.—Entry Fee — \$1.00.
- 5.—Harness Races to be on the Three Heat Plan, every heat a race. Running races to be best two out of three heats.
- 6.—Purses divided 40, 30, 20 and 10%.
- 7.—Free stabling, hay and straw to starters only.
- 8.—Entries must be made to the Secretary or to the Clerk of Course before 11.30 a.m. on the day of the race.
- 9.—No Free Admission to anyone.
- 10.—Drivers or riders must wear colours.
- 11.—50% only of prizes awarded for Trials of Speed will be paid on day of race. Balance, or a percentage thereof as provided for in Para. 12 shall be at time of payment of other prize money.
- 12.—Should it be found impossible to pay prize money in full, winners in Trials of Speed Classes shall not be given preference over winners in other Agricultural Classes in the percentage of prize money paid.
- 13.—Right is reserved by the Directors in charge to change the programme, to reject any entry, and to postpone or declare off any event.

## RULES and REGULATIONS

1. That competition for the Ohsweken Agricultural Society prizes be open to Indians of Canada and the United States and Non-Treaty Indians residing on the Reserve. This rule, however, does not apply to Class 12, Boys' and Girls' Exhibits.
2. The Annual Membership Fee, if paid on or before the first day of the Fair, will be \$1.00, after that date \$1.50 will be charged. Each exhibitor must purchase a member's ticket before making entries, a registered firm being considered as one exhibitor. If member's fee is not enclosed entries will be refused.
3. While all due care will be taken of all articles exhibited and all diligence used for the recovery of any article that may be lost, the Society will not hold itself responsible for any damage or loss of any article for competition.
4. The exhibitor's name must not be on the tag, box, etc., in which his or her produce or articles is shown, until after awards have been made.
5. Exhibitors in grains, roots, vegetables and fruits must be the owners of such and must have been raised by them during the present year. ONE SAMPLE OF EACH. Exhibitors or domestic manufacture must be owners and manufacturers of such and be prepared to certify to the fact if required.
6. Exhibitors in grain, roots, vegetables and fruits must be uniform size of boxes or baskets and must not be less than one bushel capacity except where otherwise specified.
7. MEMBERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO MAKE MORE THAN ONE ENTRY IN EACH SECTION. THIS RULE, HOWEVER, DOES NOT APPLY TO LIVESTOCK OR POULTRY.
8. All entries to be made at least one week before the first day of the Fair, by mail or in person, to the Secretary at Ohsweken, and all exhibits such as grain, roots, vegetables, domestic manufacture, etc., must be placed in the Hall by 3.00 o'clock p.m. on the first day of the Fair. Judging to begin at 4.00 p.m. Entries made on the days of the Fair will be charged 25 cents extra.
9. No. articles to be removed from the exhibition building until 4.00 p.m. on the last day of the Fair. At 4.00 pm. the building will be closed to the public, and exhibitors only will be admitted, but at 5.00 p.m. the doors will again be opened to the public.
10. All Cattle, Sheep, Poultry and Swine to be on the grounds by 10.00 o'clock a.m. on the second day of the Fair. All prize winners in cattle must be kept in the grounds until after the parade on the last day, and all horses and colts by 11.00 o'clock a.m. on the third day of the Fair, and to remain until 4.00 o'clock p.m. Judging will begin at 1.00 o'clock p.m. on each day.
11. Any member entering stock, etc., for other parties who are not members of the Society for Society prizes, shall forfeit all prizes said members may have been entitled to.
12. The exhibitor of horses and cattle must securely tie them while on the exhibition grounds, otherwise they will not be judged.

13. No animal shall be shown twice, except geldings, roadsters, brood mares and three-year-old colts, which may be shown a second time, but only in a team.

14. The exhibitor of stock and poultry must be bona fide owners of same for at least 30 days previous to the date of the exhibition.

15. That the exhibitors of horses, cattle, etc., do bring them forward when called by the judges, otherwise they will not be judged.

16. Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties, or shall on the premises of the Society use any contemptuous or abusive language to any judge or officer of the Society, shall forfeit the right to any premium to which he may be entitled, and shall be excluded from the exhibition for one year thereafter.

17. Any exhibitor practicing any deception of any kind shall upon conviction, forfeit any or all prizes she or he may be entitled to, and shall not be allowed to compete at future exhibitions of this Society for a number of years as may be determined by the Board of Directors.

18. A reward of \$5.00 will be paid to any party giving information that will lead to conviction of any exhibitor practising deception of any kind.

19. The judges are not to grant prizes on animals or articles exhibited if such do not belong to the class in which they are entered and if not considered worthy.

20. All articles of stock entered for competition must be entered in strict accordance with the Prize List in order to be eligible for a prize, the exact number or quantity stated to be strictly adhered to.

21. The decision of the judge or judges shall in all cases be final as to awarding the prizes, and no appeal shall be considered except in case of protest.

22. All protests to be made in writing by the first Monday after the Fair, accompanied by a deposit of \$1.00, to the Secretary, the same to be forfeited in case of the protest not being sustained.

22. That the sum of \$1.00 may be deducted from all prize winners who secure the sum of \$4.00 or upwards in prizes, the same to entitle such person to membership in the Society for the following year.

24. Each membership ticket shall admit to the Annual Fair the member, his wife and all his children under 12 years of age. Exhibitors of stock are also allowed one free admission for helper.

25. Exhibitors not residing on the Reserve are requested to leave their addresses with the Secretary so as to enable the Directors to have their prize money remitted to them as soon as possible after the books are made up.

26. All premiums not applied for before the 1st of December following the Fair shall be forfeited.

27. Any article that has been shown for the Society prizes for three successive years shall be barred, with the exception of Class

28. No person or persons will be permitted on the judges' stand during the Exhibition except Judges, Directors and Reporters.

29. That furious or reckless driving upon the grounds during the day of the exhibition is strictly forbidden. Any infraction of this rule will be severely dealt with by the officials.

30. All motor machines or bicycles are prohibited from the track during the exhibition.

31. Any person entering the grounds, except through the gates will be charged double fee, one half to go to the constable who detects them and the balance to the Society, which will not exempt the offender from the law.

32. Any person or persons using profane or abusive language on the Fair Grounds during the exhibition will be liable to prosecution according to law and ejection from the grounds.

33. Gates closed at 10.30 p.m. of each day of the Fair, unless otherwise arranged by the officials. All parties found trespassing on the grounds after that time will be liable to prosecution.

34. The prize money will be paid by the officials of the Society at Ohsweken on the third Monday after the Fair, except for special prizes. The Director reserve the right to pay a percentage of the prize money in case of wet weather or for any other causes.

35 Notice is hereby given that any kind of gambling, circus, monte-bank performance, exhibition or shows, also the huckstering or trafficking in spiritous or intoxicating drinks are not allowed within 300 yards of the exhibition grounds, and that 31 Vic. Chap. 29, Clauses 56, 57 and 58, relating thereto, will be enforced if any deviation from this regulation occurs.

36. Tickets for admision into the Fair Grounds and buildings for non-members will be 50c, school children free on second day, Grand Stand 25c. All vehicles 25c. Free parking of cars under supervision of an official.

37. The Society will not be responsible in any way for prices charged by concessionaries.

38. Indian women married into non-members of the Band are allowed to exhibit only in Classes 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 15.

39. All prize winners in the Horse and Cattle Classes shall take part in the Livestock Parade which will take place at 4.00 p.m. on the Race Track on the third day. Non-compliance with this rule will result in the withholding of any prize money won.

Particular attention is respectfully requested to the Rules and Regulations of the Society which are above enumerated and which will be strictly enforced.
